In Memoriam: William J. Murtaugh, Ph.D., Founding Member of US/ICOMOS



It is with great sorrow that we announce the passing of Dr. William J. Murtaugh on October 28, 2018.

A giant in the field of historic preservation, Dr. Murtagh served as the first Keeper of the National Register of Historic Places and was one of the founding members of US/ICOMOS in 1965. He served on the US/ICOMOS Board of Trustees from 1980 to 1988, and was a member of the coordinating committee responsible for planning the 1987 ICOMOS General Assembly in Washington, DC, the first ever to be held outside of Europe. US/ICOMOS named him a Fellow in 1987. In 2014, the 18th ICOMOS General Assembly meeting in Florence, Italy voted to make Dr. Murtagh an Honorary Member of the organization at the proposal of US/ICOMOS.

In 2015, the 50th Anniversary of the founding of US/ICOMOS, <u>US/ICOMOS awarded Dr. Murtaugh the Ann</u> <u>Webster Smith Award</u> because of his outstanding service to the organization from its formative years and his continuous commitment to the ideals and involvement in

heritage conservation worldwide throughout his long distinguished career. In the same year, US/ICOMOS established the Murtagh/Graham Prize for outstanding student scholarship in the area of historic preservation technologies. The Prize was established to honor the contributions and leadership of Dr. Murtagh and Roy Eugene Graham, FAIA, to preservation education and cultural heritage stewardship. Sadly, <u>Roy Graham</u> also passed away in 2018 on May 29th.

Dr. Murtagh will be buried in Penobscot, Maine. Plans are still being made for other services and memorials.

- C. Building resilience, adaptation and sustainability
- D. Considering the past and future of the U.S. World Heritage List

Attendees will also enjoy lunch at the Golden Gate Club and a Reception following the sessions on Tuesday, November 13.

On Wednesday, November 14th, we will convene at 9 am at the Officers Club of The Presidio for a plenary session moderated by Jessica Brown (New England Biolabs Foundation) on *Investing in Culture-Nature Linkages: A Conversation with Foundation Leaders* with speakers representing foundations actively supporting work linking nature and culture, including Jaune Evans (Tamalpais Trust), Kyra Busch (The Christensen Fund), Sonja Swift (Swift Foundation), and Melissa Nelson (The Cultural Conservancy). Call for Applicants: 2019 IEP

We are seeking graduate students and young professionals specialized in historic preservation and heritage conservation to participate in the US/ICOMOS IEP during the summer of 2019. Participants will be assigned to three-month, practical working internships, under professional supervision, with a public or private nonprofit preservation organization (IEP Hosts). These positions are for interns with a bachelor's degree at minimum in a preservation or conservation-related field: architecture, conservation, landscape architecture, cultural resource management, interpretation, archaeology, industrial archaeology, history or cultural tourism.
