The Venice Charter at 60

The International Charter for the Conservation and Restoration of Monuments and Sites, popularly known as the Venice Charter, was introduced at the 2nd International Congress of Architects and Technicians of Historic Monuments in Venice in 1964. It was subsequently adopted by ICOMOS in 1965 and has served ever since as a foundational document in international heritage conservation.

As the Venice Charter turns 60 in 2024, many events and symposia will be devoted to its current relevance. Three of these are described below. We hope you will join your international colleagues in these important discussions.



Save the Date: April 18

World Heritage Day, aka the International Day for Monuments and Sites (IDMS), falls every year on April 18. This year's theme is <u>"Disasters and</u> Conflicts Through the Lens of the Venice Charter." IDMS is the first of several ICOMOS events in 2024 commemorating the 60th anniversary of the Venice Charter.
